

### 3 Questions to ask at your child's parent-teacher conference in an RTI school

(All Illinois Schools)

You will likely have 15 minutes to a half hour with your child's teacher or teachers. It is important that you have a game plan to learn as much about the great things your school is doing for your child and how you may facilitate them. Below are 3 questions and follow-ups to address the major areas.

1. What level of service is my student receiving for reading, math, written expression, and social behavior? – **Hint: Ask about these areas one at a time.**
  - a. Please show me how these decisions are made?
  - b. What is their current level of performance with this level of service in each area?
  - c. How has performance changed since the last time decision making was conducted?
  - d. When is the next time my child's performance will be assessed to determine if their level of service in each area should be changed (intensified, decreased) or remain the same?
  
2. What content areas are being delivered such as science, social studies, specials etc.?
  - a. What is my child's current level of performance in these areas?
  - b. How can I help them in these areas at home?
  
3. What can I do at home to help improve the academic and social behavior of my child?
